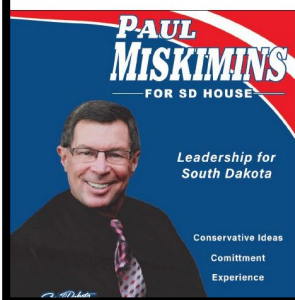
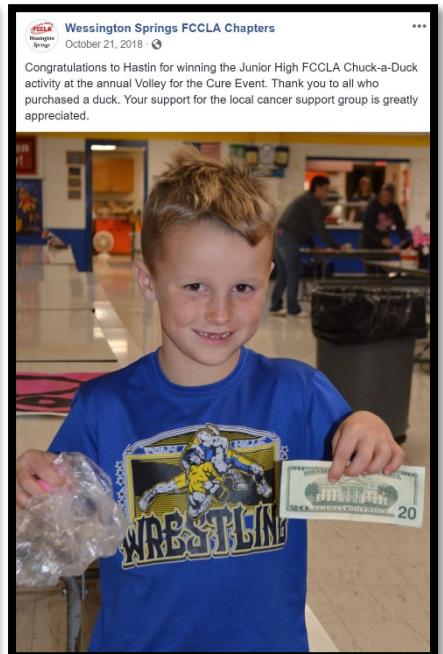


Community Service Volley for the Cure Wessington Springs Junior High FCCLA Chapter 2018-2019
